## CHAPTER 6

## I-1 INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT

5-6-5:	Performance Standards

- 5-6-1: **PURPOSE:** The I-l Industrial District is established to provide for industrial uses that will have a minimal detrimental effect on surrounding properties.
- 5-6-2: **PERMITTED USES:** All uses listed below are permitted in the I-l District provided that the performance standards listed in Section 5-6-5 are met:
- A.

  Any production, assembly, fabrication, manufacture, cleaning, servicing, testing, repair or storage of materials, goods, equipment or products.
- B. Wholesaling and warehousing; local cartage and express facilities.
- C. Lumber yards and contractors material and equipment storage yards.
- D. Public and community service uses as follows:
  - Radio and T.V. transmission towers.
  - Water filtration plants.
  - 3. Municipal or privately owned recreation buildings or community center.
  - 4. Electrical substations.

- E. Agricultural uses.
- F. Machine shops.

5-6-3: MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS: No building shall be erected or enlarged unless the following minimum requirements are met:

Lot Area:

9600 square feet

Lot Width:

80 feet

\*Front Yard:

Not required

\*Side Yard:

No required

Rear Yard:

Shall not be less than 20 feet, larger if necessary to permit space for required off-street parking and servicing.

\*Where I-l Districts adjoin D-l Districts, D-l yard dimensions will be required.

5-6-4: MAXIMUM HEIGHT: No building shall be erected or enlarged to exceed forty-five feet (45') in height.

5-6-5: **PERFORMANCE STANDARDS:** All uses in the I-l District shall comply with the following performance standards:

- All production, assembly, fabrication, manufacture, cleaning, servicing, testing or repair shall take place within completely enclosed buildings.
- Outdoor storage shall be done in the rear yard only when outdoor storage is adjacent to D-l or C-l Districts or fronts on a street or highway; the storage shall be screened by a site-obscuring fence or landscaped hedge.
- No activity in the District shall emit odor, fumes or gases, dusts, smoke, heat, glare, or vibration beyond the property line of the zoning lot.
- All uses shall comply with the performance standards as cited in the Environmental Protection Act, effective July 1, 1970 as amended, State of Illinois.
